Dear Parents & Carers.

This week started with a visit from the Local Authority Moderation Team to look at our Yr6 Writing levels. This happens to all schools every 3/4 years and we were reassured to find that they agreed with our teacher assessment. Well done, Year 6 team...it's a lot of additional work post SATs. How great to be told (officially) that we are getting it right!



Everyone a learner at Herne: At the end of last week, I took Assistant Headteachers, Erika Marshall and Amy Buckle, to Birmingham for the Inspiring Leadership Conference. Over a thousand school leaders from all over the country attend. It's hard to find good CPD (Continuing Professional Development) for Senior Leaders but this really fits the bill. We had lectures and workshops from excellent leaders in all fields of work about how to inspire teams and empower them to get the best results in any context: a Gymshark Excellence Trainer; a hostage negotiator (bizarre parallel for those working with children - scarily similar! Key tip? Don't teach 6yr olds to

negotiate!); an Olympic Gold medallist for rowing (we even got to hold THE medal!!!) and an AI (Artificial Intelligence) expert. We also took part in a Drumba session as a pre lecture warm up...think Zumba with drumming!

On a serious note, there was an underlying theme of what "best results" mean in the context of children. For the first time in many years of headship, I saw a small glimmer of light that perhaps the world will one day measure school success on the happiness and skill set of children over SAT results? I am ever the optimist - hence our pursuit of Forest School, engaging trips and a creative curriculum.

The new Government Minister for School Standards also presented the DfE manifesto for change to schools being launched in the 2025/6 academic year: a new approach to SEND; a National Curriculum rewrite (Again?) and guidance for use of AI in schools as a teaching and learning aid. The latter was (if we are honest) absolutely terrifying - how on earth do we as educators and parents stay ahead of what our children are experiencing so that our computing curriculum and parental guidance is relevant and continues to safeguard our children?



All in all, it was both inspiring and mind- blowing...particularly the Al content, which was actually quite shocking! We will spend the rest of the term making sure our training programme for next year prepares staff for the huge changes coming for school provision and provides even more opportunities to inspire our staff in order to help our children to be the best they can be academically and pastorally.

Herne Feste & our 50th Birthday


