## What I should already know?

- That people have different ideas and believe different things and that these are of equal value in British law.
- That beliefs with deities are called religions.
- That people who believe the same thing often organise themselves into groups with spiritual leaders.
- That religious groups have rituals and practices, which are specific and sometimes unique to their religion.
- That religious groups often have special buildings in which they meet to worship.
- That religious groups often have special sacred books which they use in their worship and that these sacred writings often form the basis of their beliefs.
- That religious beliefs are regarded as the truth by believers.
- That the main religion in Britain is Christianity but that there are also many religious groups in our society.

## What will I know by the end of the unit?

- The meaning of the word 'belonging'.
- The occasions and situations in which belonging is significant.
- Muslims form one of the world's largest faith groups, who follow the faith called Islam, established by the prophet Mohammed (pbuh – peace be upon him).
- Muslims call God Allah. They believe him to be the **ONLY** God.
- When a Muslim child is born a declaration of faith, called the Shahada, is whispered in its ear. This helps Muslims feel they *belong* together.
- In Islam there are 5 pillars of faith which are the central beliefs and practices of this faith.
- Reciting the shahada is the first of the 5 pillars of Islam.
- The second pillar of Islam is "salat", (prayer) which follows a set ritual.
- Muslims use a prayer mat when they pray.
- We show respect to Mohammed by following his name with these letters/ words.
