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A Note from our Headteacher

Dear Parents & Carers

Forgive me...I'm writing as truly exasperated of Petersfield this week! I should be on residential with Yr6 but spent most of last week unpicking a significant safeguarding issue involving a group of girls in upper school and their Smartphone use out of school hours! Hence, I'm back at base catching up on outstanding things! Lots to read this week!

For that reason, and as part of our joint schools' **Smartphone Free Childhood** campaign, we will, from September be following the lead taken by TPS in banning Smartphones for pupils. We will continue to have a form for parents to request permission for a Yr5 or 6 child only to bring a phone. IF they are walking alone BUT it will need to be basic, non-smart phone which only sends and receives calls and messages. We have the right to turn down an application for a child to bring a phone into school and those accepted and brought in will be locked away for the day. Our policy is clear – any abuse of this privilege or phones brought in without parental permission will result in the phone being removed and the permission being denied. There will be a formal letter from all local schools going out to all parents.

Going forward, we cannot spend huge amounts of staff time and we cannot be responsible for children's online activity outside hours. We do not have the capacity or jurisdiction for these investigations but it does affect children's relationships in school quite significantly. In future, we will be logging these safeguarding incidents on our system, recognising and dealing with friendship issues relating to them and contacting the Community Police officers for further investigation. We are also encouraging parents whose children receive abusive message/photos to contact the police.

We've tried to turn this into a positive learning opportunity by asking parents at drop off and pick up how they keep their children safe online. Thanks for sharing! There seem to be some really simple golden rules which make a huge amount of common sense:

- 1. Don't let your child take their phone to bed. You can't possibly know what they are watching, interacting with or who they are talking to if they have unchecked access. In addition, blue screen time has been shown to actively inhibit sleep.
- 2. Set your Internet access to stop at 7 or 8pm for their device.
- 3. Make sure your firewall is up to date and parental controls are switched on at home.
- 4. Make sure you have your child's passwords and check their phone and their browsing history at least weekly. (Are you aware that Snapchat deletes messages after 24 hrs? No record of your child's use or of anyone else messaging them!)
- Be firm with your child about age limits on messaging sites and stick with your principles despite peer pressure.
- 6. Put messaging sites such as Snapchat, Instagram etc. or any other sites with a 13/14 year old limit on your blocked list for their phone.
- 7. Don't let them have access to YOUR phone or your passwords (or that of any other adult) for any reason at all...even playing games! You are an adult, your use is your prerogative but children could access your messaging, browsing history or apps which may not be age appropriate.
- 8. Talk to them about why they don't need a phone at Primary school. Stem that wave of peer pressure!
- 9. Start early by embedding good practice even before children get to KS2 and model it yourself with your use. Greet your child with a smile not a Smartphone at the end of each day.

They have been wonderful to work with and hope they become well enough to return to the classroom in the future!

Miss Hannah Jordan-Norris will be taking over from Miss Tiffany Gore in Year 5. Tiff is going to be working across the school in several roles next year.

Miss Jessica Duncan is replacing the teaching vacancy left by Miss Amy Buckle as she moves out of class to be our Assistant Headteacher.

Miss Joanna Turner is going to be covering Mrs Claire Bishop's Maternity Leave in Year 4. No news of baby Bishop yet! Thanks to Mr Matt Pascoe who has covered the end of the summer term for Year 4.
