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# **Meeting With Damian Hinds MP**

Message from the Headteacher

Yesterday, I had the privilege to join with two other local East Hampshire headteachers (one primary and the other secondary) to talk directly by video call with our local MP, Damian Hinds. We made the point that, just like many sectors at the moment, we are working hard to keep our children and communities supported by remaining fully open and putting in a huge number of COVID-19 secure measures to keep everyone as safe as possible.



We reiterated the additional costs to our schools and, despite the rhetoric in the spending review this week of extra money for schools, this was in fact a re-announcement of money already committed to schools over the next three years, not new money. We also had the chance to talk at some length about our children's well-being and the impact on their mental health. We touched on the pressures for our children who are due to sit GCSEs and SATS.

In fairness, Mr Hinds really wanted to listen and engaged very professionally with us,

asking lots of questions to explore how things really are on 'the chalk front', so to speak. He asked about staff well-being too and this was reassuring that the hard working adults in our schools are not forgotten by ministers (shame about the pay freeze!) As parents at Herne know, I do have the chance on occasion to talk to those in the corridors of power, and if ever you have something that you'd like me to say from a parent viewpoint, then please talk to me or you could email Damian Hinds MP on:



An exciting opportunity has arisen for a dedicated, proactive and professional person to work in our vibrant and friendly school right here in Petersfield. You will be responsible for the security, safety, cleanliness and general maintenance of the



school site and grounds. Our highest priority is the safety and security of our children, so the ability to work alongside both adults and children is crucial. This role will suit a hard-working, proactive individual, who enjoys the variety and responsibility of site managing one of the largest junior schools in Hampshire.



Duties will involve painting, small carpentry tasks, minor plumbing tasks and deep cleaning of the buildings during school closure periods, preparing areas for school-related functions and activities, moving and setting up furniture and equipment as required; organising the cleaning (and care) of the two minibuses. We would welcome new candidates to consider being MIDAS trained to help drive the minibuses when required on school trips. These fruit trees will be sourced locally, they are 2 years old so are approximately 1.5 metres tall (growing to between 2 and 2.5 metres when mature) and will fruit next season. They normally cost £25 to £30 plus delivery, we are offering them for £20 with some mulch, a stake and instructions on how to plant included. They can be picked up at a central location in Petersfield on 19th December. Please email for more details including choice of fruit tree and to order by 4th December. There will also be an opportunity to learn how to grow a second tree from your first through another local project, *The Petersfield Community Tree Initiative*. PeCAN plans to formally launch in the Spring when your new fruit trees will be coming into blossom!
