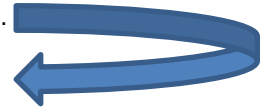

So what is STEM? This is something that challenges children to use their **Science, Technology, Engineering & Maths** skills. Having been split into two teams of five, they were tasked with designing and constructing the shell for a robot. These were put through their paces over two challenges; Robot Football and a Sumo Battle. In the Robot football, our team consisting of Jess Ferry, Grace Gibson, Dan Sampson, James Tyler and ably driven by Amber Fisher managed to reach the final which they won in a tense 1-0 match.

The second competition pitched all eight team's creations against each other in a giant sumo match. Safeguarding Our Children
