

Dear Parents & Carers,





Change for children doing LEXIA or early morning Reading. In order to increase site security in the morning, the front gate, Hoadlands gate and the side gate to the Love Lane path will be opened at 8.30 a.m. For children doing a morning club before 8.30 a.m., please come in via Breakfast Club to the right of the hall and access the school through the hall. There has been a concern about children finding unknown adults at the back of the school early in the morning. While these have been parents looking for the entrance for Lexia, it can be worrying for a child to find an unknown adult there. This change will make our children feel safer and will better facilitate the "Drop and Go" requested by the Lexia Team rather than people parking in the staff car park.

Just a reminder for all – parents should not be parking in the car park in the morning 7am to 9am nor at the end of the day 3pm- 4.15 p.m. unless you have a permit from us or we have a special morning arrangement due to your child's needs.

Staff come in from 7am and should be able to find a space and park safely. As we don't have enough staff car parking spaces, we have to double park. If parents' cars are in the car park at this time, this makes the situation harder for everyone.

Picking up from <u>after school clubs</u>, e.g. after 4.15 pm is usually fine as some staff will have left for the day, leaving some parking spaces empty.

N.B. There is one disabled spot which is by the minibuses – cars parking here should display their disability badge while on site.

And Finally, whatever you are up to this weekend, enjoy! We are very excited about singing in the square <u>next Friday</u> – come and join in with the carols!

Roblox/Al Safeguarding Warning

We have been made aware, by the Hants Safeguarding team, of a pop-up that is appearing on Roblox, encouraging children to download an app called pollybuzz (or pollyfuzz in some spelling cases). The app seems quite simple where children are asked questions, and it generates an Artificial Intelligence 'friend' – this starts off quite innocently but then begins to show extreme content (including suicide, self-harm and pornography). It may be helpful to remind children about not clicking on pop-ups in games



and to report anything that is worrying or inappropriate to a trusted adult. Roblox has parental controls and instructions of how to put these on can be accessed via this link: Parental Controls Overview — Roblox Support. Please remember that parental controls will stop some pop-ups, but not all, so appropriate supervision is still required.



Sickness Bugs

Just a reminder that in line with NHS Guidelines, we have a 48 hour rule for children who are off due to sickness/diarrhoea. Children must be off for 48 hours after the last episode of sickness or diarrhoea. This helps to protect other pupils and staff from getting ill.



E-Scooters

We are working with our local Police force to promote positive relationships and share this across our school community. This week they have asked us to share with you information about E-SCOOTERS





Did you know it's illegal to ride a privately owned electric scooter (e-scooter) in public?



That's because e-scooters are classed as motor vehicles in law. So, in theory, this means that you need an MOT, road tax and insurance to use one, however it isn't currently possible to register e-scooters in this way.

Privately owned e-scooters can only be used on private land, with the permission of the landowner.

You cannot use a privately owned e-scooter on the road, pavement or in a public space. If you do then you risk receiving a large fine, points on your driving licence and your e-scooter could be seized.

Some parts of the UK are running government trials of rental e-scooters. If you're over 16 and have a full or provisional driving licence, then you can use these on public roads and cycle paths.

Just check that your driving licence covers categories AM, A or B.
