Happy New Year! We hope you all had a good rest - the children were certainly ready to come back to school. It has been a lovely first week back. We started with our **Values Awards** for last half term's theme...**MOTIVATION!** See the happy and deserving recipients below. This half term we are working on **INDEPENDENCE**.



We are also starting to use our assemblies and class circle times to start talking to our children about the next stage of our Herne Empowerment Approach by helping them to understand brain chemistry and how it affects learning! It's fascinating stuff! Did you know that your front brain (Frontal Cortex) is the largest section of your brain and is responsible for higher level functions such as organisation, decision making, planning, timekeeping etc. It's essentially your brain's control centre. It also isn't fully developed in most people until you are about 30 years of age! This is why it is so important that all children, particularly those with neurodiversity, are actively taught how to develop these skills and understand how their brain influences their actions and responses.

And Finally, whatever you are up to this week, enjoy. Father Christmas brought me a new yoga mat so I'm off to class to try it out!






SCHOOL NURSE IN-SCHOOL CHILD HEALTH CLINICS
