Message from the Headteacher

On Friday afternoon I received the latest communication from the DfE against the backdrop of the worst figures of the pandemic to date. This guidance always comes with one link after another and it is a full time job keeping up. Along with so many other schools, we then go into overdrive to see what the latest information is all about. Whilst revisiting our COVID-19 Risk Assessment this weekend (not written up yet!), I sent a message to all parents, but aimed at our Critical Workers, just to try and reduce the risks to our community associated with lots of contacts with other households in the school building – 'vectors of transmission for the community', as the Prime Minister called it.



I have to say a huge thank you to the parents who responded to my message and reduced the days they had requested or withdrew their child from our list for the time being. THANK YOU ©. As you can imagine, my job is a constant balancing act for what is best for our children and ultimately keeping our staff as safe as possible. Overall, we have well over 85% of our children learning at home and my strategy is to pour the majority of our resource, time and effort into supporting these children. Whether this is through top quality Home Learning (thank

you amazing teachers and LSAs), ensuring households have access to devices to get onto the Internet to see what we're sending out, or trying to organise food for our Free School Meal families, these are the things that keep us awake at night. Your support is both welcome and vital, because this state of affairs is in place at least until February 12th (half-term) and quite possibly beyond.

Finally, thank you for the significant messages of support, either to me directly, through our Twitter feed, on local Facebook/social media groups or spoken to me or my staff over the phone or in our live lessons. Those lovely bits of feedback really keep us motivated to do our best for our children and our community. If you would like to contact me, you can email me as always on:

Google Classroom – Further Support

We have been so impressed how quickly the children (with support from our wonderful parents) have embraced the Home Learning on Google Classroom. The staff had their INSET DAY training back in September, which feels like a lifetime ago, so we are definitely no experts and we are learning new features and techniques every day. We have been experimenting with whole year group live lessons, class lessons, small group lessons, sharing sessions — as well as increasing the amount of video inputs we have been including to support the Home Learning. We are still in the 'experimenting stage' and I am sure it has been an absolute whirlwind of new information for parents.

Hopefully, as we move into next week, we will get into some more regular routines. This week, some year groups have experimented with publishing a weekly overview of when all the live lessons will be, so parents (and children) have more warning what is happening each day (all year groups will be introducing this very soon). With many families juggling multiple children accessing lots of different lessons, we know the more warning we can give you, the better. I hope you can see that we are working really hard so that the children can be as independent as possible, to help all our parents and ultimately support our brilliant children. A special mention must go out to Mr Edwards and Maple Class who were our test class in the Autumn term; having one class using Google Classroom at home in December really helped us prepare for the provision we are now proud to offer. As the teachers are working at 100 miles an hour to get everything all online, whilst juggling filming videos, live sessions and planning the work, there might be the odd typo, or incorrect answer or missing live link, so please be patient with us while we adjust to these new ways of teaching. ©

One thing to note: Please can you try, as much as possible, to make sure your child has no background noise if they are in a live lesson. Quite a few of the teachers have reported that they can hear televisions, conversations off-screen, excitable pets...etc. We know sometimes this is unavoidable, but where possible your support with this would be amazing.

BBC Television Helps Home Learning

We have commissioned Jack Balmer, one of our ex-pupils (who now has his own IT business) to wipe the hard drives (for safeguarding and GDPR reasons) and install wireless cards into these machines so that they will work in people's homes.
