

Home Learning Expectations

There are many things available for parents and carers (and the children) to tap into via our website and other places online, like Doodle Maths etc. It is virtually impossible for the children to replicate a normal school day of five and a half hours in your homes, so little and as often as possible is a reasonable position to take up. At the end of next week, the children would have had two weeks off, so don't feel guilty if you plan in 'no homework' days, especially if the sun is shining. If your child wants to tackle harder work, they can look at other year groups. If their year group's work is a bit tricky, look at the one below...we don't mind.



Reading or listening to books regularly is the real key to helping your child. Being able to read well opens the door to all of their other learning. Read books, listen to books and talk about books. If you haven't already done so, we can arrange for you to tap into the audio books held by Hampshire Schools Library Service. Keep the **writing** ticking over in whatever way you can think of...write your own short story, keep a diary of the crazy things you've done at home, try writing a Blog or a Vlog (making sure to keep yourself safe online), create a map with imaginary places labelled all over it.

Celebrating Successes

We are currently looking at lots of different software packages that will help with our home-learning at Herne. We have some year groups experimenting with the *J2E platform* and we have some teachers who like using the class dojo. We are always very conscious that, like many of you, a large percentage of our staff are attempting to work from home whilst they are trying to teach their own children (which is so much harder than teaching a lovely class at Herne). Therefore, any system we put in place, has to be realistic for all our teaching staff. **As an interim trial, we would like to open up our staff emails for parents.** This is an optional way that parents can send over photos and a message about any home-learning work their child is particularly proud of. Please use these emails no more than ONCE A WEEK, but the teachers would love to see what their class have been working on at home and will really enjoy responding to help motivate our young learners. The children are welcome to put in their own message, however we ask the email comes from the parents who will need to top and tail it (i.e. Dear Mrs x, this is such and such parent and here's a message from my child...) For safeguarding reasons, teachers must not have direct email contact with the children. This is just a trial and we will review it in a few weeks. The teachers are thoroughly missing their classes and are excited to see some of their hard work and hear what they have been up to.

We'll trial this next week, then have two weeks off from emails over Easter, then continue with this in the summer term, if successful. Here are the relevant work emails for our teachers:
