Design and Technology

The children will design and make a South Downs omelette.

The focus of the unit will be using local ingredients to develop tasty flavour combinations.

They will also look at the safety measures needed for cooking.

Computing:

The children will extend their work on stop motion animation. They will use the app 'Stop Motion Studio' to create their own short films. They will concentrate on keeping the movements small to ensure the film flows and on keeping the camera at the same point. They will finish by adding narration and credits and exporting their movie.

Religious Education:

The children will start by thinking about what the word 'resurrection' means. They will look at the example of Aslan in 'The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe' and think about how this could be represented symbolically. The children will then think about what the empty cross symbolises to Christians and what it means to them.

PSHE:

The children will learn about the benefits of exercise to mental and physical health and about risks associated with an inactive lifestyle. They will look at the lifestyles of some children to identify opportunities for physical activity. They will learn about the benefits of the internet and the importance of balancing time online with other activities and finish by considering how to stay safe in the sun and reduce the risk of sun burn, heat stroke and skin cancer.

Art:

The children will continue to develop their drawing skills, exploring a range of techniques to aid drawing in proportion. They will begin by drawing human figures using basic shapes and guidelines. The children will also use basic shapes and a grid method to draw a range of birds. They will understand that drawing in proportion helps artists to make their work look more realistic, although some artists deliberately choose to break this rule.

History:

Music:

This is a unit of work based on the Fresh Prince of Bel Air Charanga unit. The children will learn about warming up their voices and work towards performing a song as a group. The material presents an integrated approach to music where games, the interrelated dimensions of music (pulse, rhythm, pitch, etc), singing and playing instruments are all linked.
