 - Dramatic word choices (at least 5)
- 3. Use these definitions to help you identify the key features if you need to...

Headline:

Like a title. They can be Bold- to catch the reader's eye. Short and snappy to give a quick idea about the report and draw to the reader in. Sometimes they can be funny using alliteration or a pun.

The 5 W's are usually found in the Opening Paragraph
To answer the questions of who, what, where, when, how? for the reader

<u>Chronological order:</u>

Words and phrases which keep tell the events in time order, this is the order in which they happened.

Direct speech:

A quote from one person, to show what they said, punctuated using speech marks.

Reported speech:

Something a Witness said about what happened, but told by the reporter.

Dramatic Vocabulary:

Powerful words which can be dramatic or emotive.
