The **purpose** of a news report is to give information to the people watching.


The information will answer the questions...

WALT: report the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb.

**Today, you are going to become a news reporter!**

You need to imagine you are reporting the news of the **discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb**. If possible, you could do this **with a partner** over a video call. You will need to write your script, rehearse, and then perform it. It would be **fantastic** if you could video your completed news report and send it to your teacher (if this is possible – do not worry if you cannot).

**We would love to see it...and you!**

Your news report will need to answer the following questions...

Who?

What?

When?

Where?

How?



If you are doing this in pairs, you will need to **decide** who will answer each question and you will need to **take turns** when speaking – **plan this carefully!**

The main structure of your news reports will need to be something like this...

- Start with a summary of what has happened - Who? What? When? Where?
- Develop more of what has happened in chronological order - How?
- Add some direct quotes. For example, once he could clearly see inside the tomb, Howard Carter said he could see, “Wonderful things!”
- Conclude...What next?

Use the information from Wednesday’s lesson to help with this.

**When performing, do not forget to use your very important newsreader voice!**

When you have finished, try to evaluate your performance today (either by yourself or with a partner). You do not need to write this down but can if you wish to do so.

Did you include all of the key events?

How well did you (both) do? How did you feel?

What would you like to improve?

Do you think you managed to sound like a news reporter?

Did you enjoy performing?
