

Answers for the Bar Chart Questions.

1. Which was the earliest of the ancient civilisations? When did it begin?

The earliest ancient civilisation was the Sumerians. It began in the year 4000 BC.

2. Which of the civilisations lasted for more than 1,000 years?

Four of the civilisations lasted for more than a thousand years, they were the Sumerians, the Indus Valley, the Ancient Egyptians and the Romans.

3. Which civilisation was Jesus born into? How long after his birth did that civilisation continue for?

Jesus was born into the Roman Empire, which continued for another 476 years. (Our calendar is counted from the year Jesus was born, the year 0, so right now, it is 2020 years since Jesus' birth.)

4. Which ancient civilisation existed for the longest amount of time and how long was it?

The Ancient Egyptian civilisation lasted for the longest time; it existed for about 3200 years.

5. How much longer was the Ancient Egyptian civilisation than the Ancient Sumerian civilisation?

The Sumerians existed for about 900 years less than the Ancient Egyptians.

6. Which civilisation was ancient Britain part of?

Ancient Britain was part of the Roman civilisation. It lasted for around one third of the total time of the Romans.

7. Which was the most recent civilisation and what year did it end?

The most recent civilisation is the Romans, which ended around 450AD.
