





Remember if it is asking you to share or divide to say “How many” and count on your fingers using your tables.


E.g. divide 18 by 3. Instead say how many 3's in 18. Use your fingers to count up, however many fingers you have used counting in 3's is your answer.

Top Tips!

Draw out the problem – drawing circles always helps.
Use counters or blocks or buttons (any thing you can easily count).
If the question is asking for a fraction – divide!
You can also carry on




Remember!


