



90 Until the crops are ploughed.



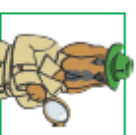
