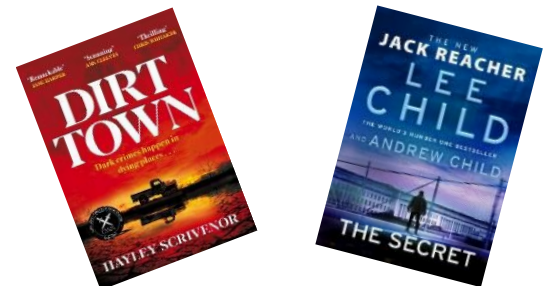

After School Clubs – IMPORTANT

Please can parents inform the office if your child is not going to be attending an afterschool club. Each club takes a register and if your child is not at the club, having been at school that day, you will receive a safeguarding telephone call to establish their whereabouts. Making numerous unnecessary telephone calls may delay genuine identification and subsequent action concerning a missing child. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Club Collection Reminder

Just a reminder, that if you are collecting a child who has been at an after-school club inside school - the collection point is the front office door. Outside clubs, the collection point is the Herne Hideout area (by the top of the basketball playground steps). If you are late collecting from an after-school club, the club teacher will not leave them unattended. If you are significantly late your child can wait in Twilight Club who will be either in the playground or the hall.

So, on this day we are asking the children to bring a favourite teddy (or any cuddle toy) in and to bring a small donation (no donation is too small – every penny will help).

Twilight Club Bookings – IMPORTANT REMINDER

If you have reserved a space on a day and haven't booked the session online, we will book your children into their sessions onto ParentPay on the session day only. This will debit your account of your session fee and, if you are not in credit, your account balance will drop further into debt. You cannot book sessions unless you are in credit.

- Please keep your accounts in credit. Please book the sessions in advance. (Making a payment by any method does not automatically do this).
- If paying by voucher, please allow a week for your Parentpay account to be credited. Please inform admin@hernejunior.com of the date vouchers were paid, the amount, the child's name and company used so we identify the payment and credit ParentPay.
- Please endeavour to stay in credit regardless of your means of paying and please book in advance. Failure to do so may result in us withdrawing the place.
- Please note that a months notice is required to cancel your twilight space.
